DESCRIPTION

The Fr. Gafney, SJ Mission Trip Program began in 1997 and is named after St. Ignatius alum, Fr. Thomas J. Gafney, SJ '50. Fr. Gafney, SJ was martyred in Nepal in 1997. Over the last twenty years, the program has offered students an opportunity to directly encounter the poor and marginalized, resulting in a deepened relationship with God and those on the margins.

The Fr. Gafney, SJ Mission Trips encapsulate the heart of an Ignatian education: prayer, service, reflection, learning, and direct encounters with the poor.

Repair homes for families in need with students from across the country

WHAT? Join over 100 volunteers from all over the country at the Wayne County Work Camp in rural West Virginia. Since 1983, this camp has provided opportunities for volunteers of all faiths to put faith into practice by doing home repair for local families. You will get to know the family you serve as you live, work and pray with the people of the

Wayne County community.

Louisville, KY

Immerse yourself in direct service to refugees and the marginalized of Louisville

WHAT? This is a week-long immersion experience rooted in inner-city Louisville that emphasizes the bonds of relationships over acts of service. Students are divided into small groups and given the opportunity to spend time with people on the margins. All participants are asked to live simply and participate in prayer and reflection. Students often discover new understandings of themselves, friendships with people they might

never have met, and a new vision for living their faith.

WHAT? This is an educational immersion trip with opportunities for service. On this trip, you will learn about the history of the Civil Rights Movement in America by traveling the steps of great American leaders like Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

You will learn about the interesting challenges of poverty, race, and access to education, healthcare, and jobs.

<u>Cleveland, OH</u>

A deep dive into homelessness will show you a different side of the city you call home.

WHAT? Participants will learn the stories of homeless men and women who are friends of the Labre ministry, experience a "day in the life" of a homeless person, learn about the agencies that work with the poor, and explore problems and potential solutions to the issue of homelessness. While local, this is an overnight trip that will take students outside their comfort zone all within city limits.

WHAT? This trip focuses on direct service to low-income communities in the Appalachian region. Possible projects include work in soup kitchens, home rehab services, or an after school program. Participants will explore how coal mining and economic development have affected the natural environment and experience Appalachian culture.

Mexico (Kino Border Trip)

Direct encounter with migrants fleeing violence and poverty in Latin America

WHAT? Immigration is a controversial topic with complex facets. Participants will journey to Nogales, AZ, to immerse themselves in the issues surrounding the US/Mexico border and hear first-hand from: border patrol agents, missionaries, and immigrants. The Kino Border Initiative will help us to humanize, accompany and complicate the issue.

WHAT? This trip offers both exciting experiences and major physical and emotional challenges. Students explore solidarity with the poor and need to be prepared for primitive living conditions and simple meals. Activities include building latrines in rural villages and staying with a local family.

You will get to know the people of Guatemala through service, assisting in the nursery and schools, building homes and classrooms, and helping to prepare meals. After purposeful, meaningful days, you will return to a retreat center for dinner, discussion and reflection. You will visit Antigua and Atitlan as well.
