Position Profile: Languages Teacher

About the Position:

Saint Ignatius High School, a highly successful Jesuit college preparatory school for boys in Cleveland, Ohio, is seeking an exceptional full-time Languages teacher beginning in the 2020-21 school year. This full-time appointment will utilize his/her versatility in and knowledge of multiple languages. Experience teaching college prep is a plus, as well as interest in participating in and/or moderating student extracurricular activities. The preferred candidate will teach sections of French/Spanish or French/Latin or Spanish/Latin classes, engage in ongoing professional development, and be actively involved in the spiritual formation of our students. Candidates qualified in only one of the languages will also be considered. An annual professional development allowance and numerous personal and professional growth opportunities are offered.

Primary Areas of Responsibility:

- Daily responsibilities include planning for and teaching five sections and reporting to various proctoring assignments.
- Daily management of groups of up to thirty students per class in a college-preparatory setting.
- Select and plan appropriate learning and teaching activities that are in alignment with SIHS standards.
- Exercise good classroom management with the use of fair and consistent standards and appropriate sanctions that are clearly articulated to the students.
- Encourage students to ask questions and to express their difficulties.
- Know and use a wide range of assessment strategies consistent with course content and objectives.

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree in French, Latin, or Spanish. Master's degree is preferred.
- Experience teaching two of the three languages offered (French, Latin, Spanish) preferred
- Current Ohio teaching license in high school or eligibility to obtain.

- Passion for teaching foreign language is essential.

The successful candidate will demonstrate:

- A strong commitment to the values of Catholic, Jesuit education
- Dedication to student learning and achievement
- A willingness to participate in extracurricular activities
- An exemplary work ethic characterized by high standards of ethics and personal conduct, honesty, integrity, and professionalism

About Saint Ignatius High School:

Saint Ignatius High School, which opened its doors September 6, 1886, is a Jesuit college-preparatory school. The school enrolls more than 1,500 young men who hail from 96 cities in a nine-county region.

Academically, Saint Ignatius is a regional and state leader in National Merit finalists. To challenge students and prepare them for college, the Saint Ignatius curriculum offers 17 Advanced Placement (AP) and 21 honors subjects. In September 2009, the school was designated a Blue Ribbon school by the U.S. Department of Education.

A Saint Ignatius education prepares students to become competent, concerned and socially responsible members of their communities. With a motto of Men for Others, there is a prime concern for the development of Christian values among all students. Part of the Saint Ignatius student experience includes the promotion of faith in the service of justice.

Located in close proximity to downtown Cleveland in the vibrant and energetic Ohio City neighborhood, the school occupies 23 acres and includes 19 buildings and three

athletic fields. The school has 120 faculty members, 90 percent of whom hold advanced degrees. Fifty-seven percent have spent 10 years or more teaching at Saint Ignatius.
