LITURGY, PRAYER, SACRAMENTS

Campus Ministry works to prepare all Eucharistic and sacramental opportunities for the student body. Annual all-school Masses include Mass of the Holy Spirit, All Saints Day, Immaculate Conception, Ash Wednesday, End-of-Year Mass, and other Jesuit or Church feasts.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered to all students through Theology classes in Advent and Lent. Morning prayer and the Examen are offered over the P.A. each day and Eucharistic Adoration is offered each Friday.

RETREATS

For juniors and seniors, retreats are a central spiritual experience of their faith formation at Saint Ignatius. Our school has made a tremendous investment of time and resources into designing retreats that seek to facilitate each student's personal encounter with God.

Over 25 retreat options are made available to the upperclassmen, including: **Kairos, Wilderness, COPE, Emmaus, and Individual Spiritual Direction.** Retreats are so important in our tradition of Ignatian Spirituality that our school requires all students to make one of these 3-to-4 day retreats during their junior year. Many students go on to serve as a retreat leader or make another retreat their senior year.

Sophomores spend one period per week during their semester of Sophomore Service learning to pray in the manner of the *Spiritual Exercises* of St. Ignatius. This program is called **Contemplatives in Action.**



PASTORAL CARE

Although the entire school community is responsible to one another for care and support, Campus Ministry makes every effort to support students at all times by offering personal and pastoral care. Campus Ministers also accompany students in the school's Sports Chaplaincy program and offer the opportunity to become Catholic through the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) program.

MISSION TRIPS

Through the **Father Thomas Gafney, S.J. '50 Student Mission Program**, Campus Ministry provides opportunities to participate in international and domestic mission trips during the summer. The primary goal of this experience is to follow the example of Jesus Christ who left his home to share the Gospel message with the world and showed a special concern for people living on the margins of society.

Participants are invited to investigate and reflect upon injustice and to incorporate an understanding of Catholic social teaching into their life and spirituality with the hope that students will grow in solidarity with one another and those they encounter on these trips. Cultural immersion, service and reflection characterize these mission experiences.



PEACE & JUSTICE

Campus Ministry works alongside the school's **Christian Action Team** to encourage students to participate in Christian Service and consider how our faith calls us to be committed to peace and justice. Through **Ignatians for Peace and Justice, Ignatians for Life, and Catholic Schools for Peace and Justice**, students are invited to participate in the annual Ignatian Family Teach-In, March for Life, and Arrupe Leaders Summit in addition to other Diocesan-wide events.

EVANGELIZATION

Empowering students to share the Good News of the Gospel is done through the Ignatian Companions, a mentoring program designed to form students as faith leaders across campus.
