OUR ROLE AS SCHOOL COUNSELORS

- Counseling students to meet their academic, career, college, personal, social and spiritual needs

- Provide referrals and work with outside mental health and chemical dependency agencies as needed
- Provide programming, groups, and crisis support for all students.

OUR PROGRAMS

Academic and Personal Counseling

Individual/Small Group Counseling

to review academic and personal progress and goals

Cura Personalis Program

to assist students with diagnosed learning disabilities, social and emotional needs or crisis intervention

Collegiate Summer Programs

to provide information and recommendations for summer enrichment opportunities

Social Support Groups (may vary from year to year)

Family Issues Group

provides support to students from divorced or single-parent families

Grief Group

assists students dealing with the loss of a loved one or friend

CARE Team

provides educational awareness for parents and students regarding alcohol and illegal substances
