About the Position:

Saint Ignatius High School, a highly successful Jesuit college preparatory school for boys in Cleveland, Ohio, is seeking an exceptional Visual Arts teacher beginning in the 2020-2021 school year. Experience teaching college prep is a plus, as well as interest in participating in and/or moderating student extracurricular activities. This teacher will teach five sections, engage in ongoing professional development, and be actively involved in the spiritual formation of our students. An annual professional development allowance and numerous personal and professional growth opportunities are offered.

As a Catholic School in the Jesuit tradition, Saint Ignatius has been educating "Men for Others" for over 130 years. The school is known locally, as well as nationally, as a leader in educational excellence. At graduation, students will be open to growth, intellectually competent, religious, loving, and committed to peace and justice.

- Plan for and teach five sections and be responsible for one proctoring assignment.
- Expect to guide college-preparatory learning and teaching activities that align with our school standards.
- Bring experience with, or are open to, a wide range of assessment strategies which will summatively and formatively help students achieve course objectives.

- Experience with extra-curricular activities such as moderating clubs and activities also highly desirable

Saint Ignatius High School, which opened its doors September 6, 1886, is a Jesuit college-preparatory school. The school enrolls more than 1,500 young men who hail from 96 cities in a nine-county region.

Academically, Saint Ignatius is a regional and state leader in National Merit finalists. To challenge students and prepare them for college, the Saint Ignatius curriculum offers 17 Advanced Placement (AP) and 21 honors subjects. In September 2009, the school was designated a Blue Ribbon school by the U.S. Department of Education.

A Saint Ignatius education prepares students to become competent, concerned and socially responsible members of their communities. With a motto of Men for Others, there is a prime concern for the development of Christian values among all students. Part of the Saint Ignatius student experience includes the promotion of faith in the service of justice.

Located in close proximity to downtown Cleveland in the vibrant and energetic Ohio City neighborhood, the school occupies 23 acres and includes 19 buildings and three athletic fields. The school has 120 faculty members, 90 percent of whom hold advanced degrees. Fifty-seven percent have spent 10 years or more teaching at Saint Ignatius.
